FDC Cebu agrees with Atty. Bontuyan that there is a need to strengthen the ERC personnel doing the administrative functions. There is a necessity to increase the number of field personnel as well as skilled		

administrative functions. There is a necessity to increase the number of field personnel as well as skilled professionals in the following essential services: legal operations [lawyers], market operations [WESM-related operations, etc.] and regulatory operations [accountants, economists]

FDC Cebu also shared the suggestions of some members present during the previous RDC Sub-Committee on Power meeting that some cases [not involving rate fixing functions] may be referred to a Conciliator [similar to that in the construction business] who may make recommendations for adoption by the Commission – which in a way could effectively help in fast-tracking resolution of cases.
